US PULLS OUT OF PARIS AGREEMENT

Re-negotiation unlikely

Delivering an address from the White House this week, President Trump declared he was [withdrawing the US](#) from the Paris climate agreement, siding with isolationist pressures in his White House who argued that the agreement was a "threat to the economy and American sovereignty". By withdrawing, he ignored the mounting pressure from the global community and business leaders who urged him to remain part of the deal.

The Paris agreement was intended to bind the world community into battling rising temperatures together, and the departure of the US – the world's second-largest polluter – is a major blow. [READ MORE](#)

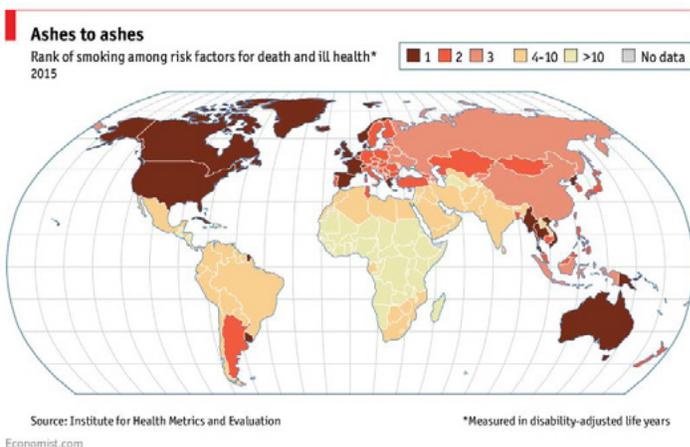

FARMED FISH TO DOMINATE

Wild catch to be overtaken

According to the [UN Food and Agricultural Organization](#), farmed fish production is expanding 4 to 5 per cent a year, putting it on course to eclipse the output of wild fishing as soon as 2019.

"This is similar to what took place in agriculture many centuries ago," said Audun Lem, deputy-director of FAO's fisheries and aquaculture department. "The overall impact on nutrition, food security and human development will be equally large."

HIGHER CABRON PRICES NEEDED

Looking for \$50-100 per tonne by 2030

A group of economists warned this week that the cost of emitting carbon dioxide must rise to USD 50 - USD 100 per tonne by 2030 if countries want to meet climate pledges made under the Paris Agreement. This is much higher than the current price in Europe of less than USD 6 per tonne.

"If we are going to meet the commitments of Paris, we will have to have prices (at those levels) ... The costs of not doing it will be much higher," Columbia University Professor Joseph E. Stiglitz, a commission member, [told a news briefing](#).

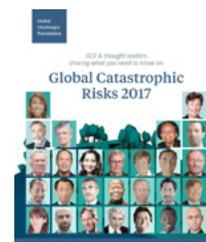

ExxonMobil shareholders voted to back a climate change resolution co-filed by New York State Common Retirement Fund and the Church of England this week. Shareholders secured a 62% vote in favor of the climate change resolution, a significant leap from last year's 38%.
